CRANBERRY WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 158 147 ACRES

- Bear, deer, snowshoe hare, squirrel, turkey
- Elevations ranging from 1,900 to 4,600 feet in mountainous terrain covered with mature hardwood forests
- State Route 150, 39, 7, 48, and 46 provide access to the area

HANDLEY WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 784 ACRES

- Bear, deer, grouse, turkey, waterfowl, woodcock
- Rolling hills and scattered steep slopes covered in hardwood forest, about 10% of the area is openings
- State Route 17, which intersects U.S. Route 219 at Edray, approximately four miles north of Marlinton. From the Highland Scenic Highway, turn south on FR86 (Williams River Road) and State Route 17/4 following WVDNR signs to the area

LITTLE RIVER WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 124 483 ACRES

- Bear, deer, grouse, snowshoe hare, squirrel, turkey, woodcock, bobcat,
- Northern hardwoods cover the mountainous terrain with oak-hickory and black cherry; white pine and red pine also present
- Access the area from U.S. Route 250, as well as State Route 28 and 92

NEOLA WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 104,750 ACRES

- Bear, deer, grouse, rabbit, squirrel, turkey, waterfowl
- Oak-hickory and oak-pine forest cover 90% of the rugged terrain
- Access is available from State Route 92 and 39

RIMEL WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 67,251 ACRES

- Bear, deer, grouse, rabbit, squirrel, turkey
- Mountainous terrain with oak-hickory, oak-pine and northern hardwood forests Access is by state routes 39, 28, 92, and 84. Thirty miles of paved roads and 46 miles of unpaved secondary roads traverse the area

SLATYFORK WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 79 ACRES

- Deer, squirrel, turkey
- Northern hardwoods cover the mountainous terrain with oak-hickory, black cherry, white pine and red pine also present
- ☐ Turn off U.S. route 219 at Beckwith Lumber Company near Slatyfork onto a gravel road that travels through the lumber company's property. This road terminates at WVDNR parking lot

TEA CREEK WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA: 67 919 ACRES

- Northern hardwood forest cover the mountainous terrain
- State Route 39 and the Highland Scenic Highway Route 150

STATE FORESTS

CALVIN PRICE STATE FOREST: 9,482 ACRES

- Moderately rugged, covered in mixed hardwoods and pine
- Accessible from State Route 39 east of Marlinton

SENECA STATE FOREST: 11,684 ACRES

- Pine-hardwood forest cover the gently sloping to hilly terrain ranging in elevation from 2,000 to 3,600 feet
- Area is along State Route 28, 10 miles south of Green Bank
